



**BY GEOGRAPHIC AREA**



**What It Takes**

In 2001, 266 organizations in Hawaii and the Pacific, and 182 organizations on the U.S. Mainland received close to \$1.4 million in total from the Alexander & Baldwin Foundation.

Our desire is to play a role in providing the resources to meet the priorities of our communities—be it for construction of a Polynesian voyaging canoe or to assist Hawaii's deaf community to develop special programs.

What it takes, in the A&B Foundation's case, is community agencies, armed with special expertise and a desire to tackle a problem, working with us to seize an opportunity. Often, the agencies' strengths include the active volunteer support of A&B employees. And always, our grants reflect our confidence in the board leadership and day-to-day management of these agencies.

**What It Means**

The numbers, graphs and lists of individual grants which follow in this *Review of Giving*, detail what it means: that the A&B Foundation remains committed to meeting diverse needs of dynamic communities in which Alexander & Baldwin employees live and work.

What can you tell about our priorities and practices? Our interests include causes as diverse as our employees' many heritages. These organizations could be neighborhood-focused, targeted to a single city, serving a whole island or broadly impacting an entire state. The resources provided by the A&B Foundation range from start-up funding to major capital support, in grants ranging from \$100 to \$180,000.

What does it mean? Those who give the most valuable gift of all—time from their busy schedules—can direct the A&B Foundation's resources to their favorite charity.






