## NGAGE

Throughout 2003, the leaders of the Alexander & Baldwin Foundation engaged in dialogue with A&B's communities, and the non-profit organizations that strengthen them, in the course of our consideration of hundreds of requests for charitable support. These requests reflected the needs of our communities—needs ranging from early childhood education, to musical and artistic enrichment, to meals for our elders. We engaged in thoughtful deliberation about these needs and, by year's end, approved more than 350 grants totaling \$1.44 million for agencies in Hawaii and in key communities of the U.S. mainland.

## ENABLE

These grants enabled charitable agency leadership, staff and volunteers to serve their clients be they hungry families aided by a food bank or eager schoolchildren intent on mastering new technology. And these monies were available thanks to the dedicated efforts of the employees of Alexander & Baldwin, Inc. and its subsidiaries, whose work enables the company to generously fund the A&B Foundation.

### EMPOWER

Particularly intriguing to us are those grants which empower people in our communities to help themselves or to help each other. As a Hawaii-based company, we believe this goes to the root of the "aloha spirit" and what Hawaii is all about, and it's something we value greatly. We also believe it is the core for any healthy community, anywhere. In 2003, 242 organizations in Hawaii and the Pacific, and 60 organizations on the U.S. Mainland received \$1.442 million in total from the Alexander & Baldwin Foundation; this figure includes nearly \$105,000 in donations to 195 additional schools and charities to match gifts by individual donors via a matching gifts program.


The awards from the A&B Foundation ranged from start-up funding to major capital support, in grants sized from \$100 to \$173,500.




#### **BY GEOGRAPHIC AREA**



**UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII AT HILO** (\$5,000) Enrollment has increased 30 percent in the last five years, as UH Hilo builds its reputation as an option for students who want a four-year degree in a small, residential campus environment. A&B's grant funds an outreach program to enroll college-bound in-state high school seniors and community college transfers, and the evening events enable students to get a guided tour, view the facilities and learn first-hand about campus life and the curriculum.



**WAIKIKI HEALTH CENTER** (\$2,000) Headquartered in Waikiki for more than 30 years, the Waikiki Health Center provides primary medical care to a wide spectrum of patients: children, adults, tourists, the elderly, and the homeless. All in a good days work you might say, but many of the patients have minimal or no medical insurance. The Waikiki Health Center enables its patients to receive affordable care like an annual physical, school immunization and treatment for a cold or flu without the worry of high costs. A&B's grant funded electrical upgrades to the center's main facility.



**ADULT FRIENDS FOR YOUTH** (\$3,000) Begun a dozen years ago as a gang-prevention program, the Student Transition Convention targets the 'tween age group'—students moving from elementary to middle school—to provide them with tips to recognize undesirable and anti-social behaviors and the reasons students fall into them, and to offer support that they are not going through these 'growing pains' alone. On Kauai, the humor of comedian Frank De Lima enables attendees to laugh at themselves, through the foil of caricatures Frank creates.

AMERICAN HEART ASSOCIATION (\$10,000) 'Fighting heart disease and stroke' is the mission of the American Heart Association. A new grant supports a grass-roots effort to educate the most vulnerable citizens on Maui and Kauai about the signs of stroke. This knowledge will empower them to recognize the symptoms of stroke in themselves and their loved ones and, importantly, seek prompt medical treatment.



**KAUAI HABITAT FOR HUMANITY** (\$5,000) Equal parts of sweat, elbow grease, dedication and the help of Habitat's professional home builders empowers future homeowners and volunteers in West Kauai to do what our forefathers did: build their own homes. This grant supports affordable housing and endorses the concept of earning 'sweat equity.'



**BIKEWAYS MAUI** (\$2,500) Bikeways Maui gained a start-up grant to promote and develop an island-wide pathway system as alternative transportation options for walking and biking enthusiasts in our temperate climate. As Maui's transportation infrastructure is developed or improved, the option of 'safe cycling' on separate bikeways is an attractive one and could literally empower the pedal.

# ENDURING

**EAST MAUI WATERSHED PARTNERSHIP** (\$10,000 via the Research Corporation of the University of Hawaii) To protect Maui's watershed from environmental degradation, a fence is being installed around a 10,000-acre area that is vulnerable to non-native animal species, particularly ungulates such as pigs and deer. Proper stewardship of this important conservation land—which today provides water for 20,000 Upcountry residents—will provide enduring benefits for generations to come, and is the goal of this multi-landowner partnership.

## **SMITHSONIAN'S NATIONAL MUSEUM OF AMERICAN HISTORY** (\$100,000 over 2 years) Matson Navigation Company's Oakland container yard has been recreated in "America on the Move," an exhibition that highlights the impacts of transportation on American life. Matson refurbished and donated three 1970s shipping containers for use in creating the setting. Subsequently, the A&B Foundation provided funds for a new exhibition, "On the Water: Stories from Maritime America," which will explore maritime life in America from 1600 to the present. Still under development, "On the Water" will feature stories of people and their experiences on America's oceans, rivers, lakes, and shores. More than 5 million people visit the Museum each year.

SAN FRANCISCO MARITIME NATIONAL HISTORICAL PARK (\$25,000, over 2 years) The scow schooner Alma, built in 1891 and named for the ship builder's granddaughter, endures as one of the Maritime Park's fleet of historic vessels docked at Hyde Street Pier, thanks to donations such as A&B's. She has been repaired and refurbished up to U.S. Coast Guard standards, enabling her use in an onboard seagoing youth education project named "Schooners Under Sail."



**ADOPT-A-WATERSHED** (\$1,500) Adopt-A-Watershed uses hands-on, environment-based education to empower Mainland communities to care for their watersheds to improve the habitat's health. They bring together natural resource agencies, community organizations, businesses, educators, and landowners. With its primary base in California, AAW has trained more than 20,000 teachers and community leaders who reach more than 200,000 students with educational programs they developed.



**PACIFIC ARTS FOUNDATION** (\$2,500) The film 'Hawaii's Ice Epidemic' focused attention directly on the horrific impacts of the highly addictive illegal drug, crystal methamphetamine, on Hawaii's families and communities. With this film and a community awareness campaign, filmmaker Edgy Lee engaged the public, directed their attention to the extent of the problem, and galvanized support for addiction prevention programs and rehabilitation for offenders. 



**CHARTER SCHOOL RESOURCE CENTER** (\$1,000 via UH Foundation) Five years after charter school legislation passed, an A&B grant supported a 2003 Charter School Resource Center Conference to engage teachers and administrators in an effort to mesh their school with their communities, and with the businesses in the area. Hawaii currently has 25 charter schools supplementing its public and private schools.



**SEABURY HALL** (\$20,000) Forty years after its founding, Seabury Hall is a fully-accredited, coeducational college prep school located in Makawao, Maui, with a mission to engage the most capable students from all segments of the community and provide them a superior college preparatory education. Nearly 400 students in grades 6-12 are benefiting from a major grant to support the renovation and expansion of Seabury's classroom buildings.

**BIG BROTHERS BIG SISTERS OF MAUI** (\$6,300) Volunteer mentors serve as positive role models for at-risk youth by helping with tutoring, and providing after-school and weekend activities such as this introduction to kite surfing. Their mission is to make a positive difference in the lives of children and youth and to assist them in achieving their highest potential as they grow to become confident, competent and caring individuals. The A&B Foundation partially funded a volunteer recruitment effort and several other fundraising activities.
