



Aloha,

In 2005, the A&B Foundation – thanks to the generosity of its funding corporation – had an exceptional year with more than \$2 million given to charitable organizations throughout Hawaii, in the Pacific region, and on the U.S. Mainland. A record number of grants were awarded to 493 separate non-profits.

This increase in grant-making activity was due, in part, to two special programs. These programs were created to support the desire of A&B employees to provide help—way beyond our shores—to those impacted by the two devastating natural disasters of 2005. Hundreds of personal donations made by A&B employees to tsunami relief efforts around the Indian Ocean and to hurricane relief in the U.S. Gulf Coast were matched, dollar-for-dollar, by the A&B Foundation. While heartbreaking to witness such extensive loss, it was uplifting to witness and support the big and small efforts that grew from each individual's vow to help a friend, neighbor or stranger in need.

This year's Hawaiian theme "Kokua Kekahi I Kekahi" translates to 'helping one another.' It expresses the spirit that brings neighbors close and strangers closer as they work together—with the utmost of compassion, commitment and optimism—to make tomorrow better than today. Helping one another, through good times and bad, strengthens the ties we share and depend upon—particularly in our island communities.

For the third year, kokua (help) from the A&B Foundation was provided to meet priority needs of our communities, identified by A&B employees who live and work in those communities—drug prevention, homeownership, clean communities and the development of our youth. Boosting our efforts in these areas was the kokua, the volunteer support, from our A&B employees. They lifted the frame of a house for a new homeowner on Kauai and installed siding and wallboard for other homeowners on Maui. They combed the coastlines in Hawaii, California, Guam, Phoenix and Chicago for trash, protecting our marine environment. They cared, and they helped.

In addition to the A&B Foundation's activities, our funding company, A&B, provided additional charitable contributions totaling nearly \$180,000. Add to that the personal donations of employees and retirees of over \$250,000, the A&B ohana (family) contributed a meaningful \$2.5 million in 2005 to make our communities a healthy and safe place to live, work and raise a family.

But that's what it's all about. Working together. Helping each other. This look back, our 2005 Review of Giving, features projects and programs that received a helping hand from A&B Foundation, from A&B and from A&B's employees and retirees. We look forward to Kokua Kekahi I Kekahi, helping one another, in the years to come.



Merwin For the first time in fifteen years, the Alexander & Baldwin Foundation exceeded the \$2 million mark in charitable contributions, helping organizations improve their facilities, expand their programs and services, and rebuild their communities, all with a purpose to improve the quality of life of the people served.

These additional dollars enabled us to reach deeper into communities as we supported more major and capital requests and were able to respond to needs that were time-sensitive in nature. In 2005, 312 organizations in Hawaii and the Pacific, and 181 organizations on the U.S. mainland received a helping hand from the A&B Foundation, a 30% increase from the number of 2004 recipients. This figure includes nearly \$102,000 in matching gift donations to an additional 186 schools and charities triggered by individual donors' gifts of cash and volunteer time, and more than \$57,000 in employee matching funds for relief efforts of the Indian Ocean tsunami and Hurricane Katrina.

### GIVING BY GEOGRAPHIC AREA AND CATEGORY



As you can see from the numbers below, the A&B Foundation's support continues to be broad-based, reflecting our current desire—and ability—to address a spectrum of community needs in each of our key communities. Health & human service agencies benefited from more than \$777,000; educational causes received roughly \$465,000; culture and arts organizations were given more than \$349,000; community causes were awarded roughly \$359,000; and environmental organizations were granted more than \$135,000.

The awards from the A&B Foundation ranged from start-up funding to major capital support, in grants sized from \$100 to \$135,000. The majority of our awards were below \$5,000 as our preference is to support a wide range of community organizations and encourage organizations to seek broad-based support from the community and its businesses.

In addition to monetary support from the A&B Foundation, A&B employees increased the impact of A&B's involvement by offering their *kokua* (help) by volunteering for several Foundation-sponsored community service projects.

Throughout 2005, the A&B Foundation funded opportunities for people to come together to help one another. These opportunities were derived from priority needs identified by A&B employees. Here's how we helped...

### **DRUG PREVENTION**

### Youth Empowering Systems -Conference on Chemical Dependency (\$5,000)

Drugs and alcohol are disabling our youth and our families, therefore, Youth Empowering Systems organized a two-day statewide training conference on substance abuse in December 2005. Nationally recognized experts and keynote speakers were brought to Maui to address adolescent behaviors related to chemical dependency, prevention and treatment, and support the educators, counselors and community members who are helping to fight the battle against drugs.

### HOMEOWNERSHIP

### **Prepare Fairs** (\$30,000)

Two homebuyer education fairs were presented for the first time on Kauai intended to inform, prepare and encourage first-time home ownership. They were dubbed, for marketing purposes, Prepare Fairs, which included workshop presentations from contractors, Realtors, and self-help housing officials, offering their expertise. Funded in 2004, the A&B Foundation worked with the Contractors Association of Kauai and Self-Help Housing Corporation of Hawaii to coordinate two events that drew strong participation from exhibitors and residents—over 300 attendees per fair. A third fair on Kauai is being funded, planned with an April 29, 2006 date.

### Habitat for Humanity -Maui (\$10,000) and Kauai (\$15,000)

One of the ways a family can own a home is by 'sweat equity.' Habitat for Humanity offers low-income residents an opportunity to build their home along with the support and expertise of the construction industry and volunteers. A lead sponsorship grant from the A&B Foundation for Habitat's Build-a-Thon events on Maui and Kauai, enabled the organization to raise awareness about the event and Habitat's mission, increase volunteer support and interest from prospective firsttime home builders. On Saturday, June 25, hundreds of volunteers across the state helped new homeowners realize their dream.

### **CLEAN COMMUNITIES**

### **International Coastal Cleanup** (\$12,500)

The A&B Foundation was a statewide sponsor of the International Coastal Cleanup (ICC) that took place in Hawaii and across the globe. On September 17, A&B employees in Hawaii, California, Guam, Phoenix and Chicago combed parks and shorelines

for trash and debris that would otherwise end up in the ocean and harming the marine environment. In recognition of the 20th Anniversary of the ICC, the A&B Foundation also sponsored the coordinators conference held in Honolulu.

### **COMMUNITY ISSUES**

### **KEEP Fund** (\$100,000)

A February fire at A&B's Kahului Shopping Center on Maui destroyed three businesses, affecting 65 employees. The A&B Foundation offered financial support to these displaced (non-A&B) employees temporarily relieving the burden of their personal finances. Maui Economic



Opportunity served as fiscal sponsor for this effort and coordinated the disbursement of funds for the A&B Foundation.

### **Maui Community Food Bank** (\$10,000)

The Maui Community Food Bank's Spring Food Drive is the largest of its three annual food drives which collected cash and food donations at A&B's Maui Mall. The A&B Foundation helped to stimulate donations by offering a \$10,000 matching challenge grant triggered by food donations or a shopper's Maui Mall receipts. The Maui Community Food Bank raised well over the \$10,000 needed.

### **Maui Community College** (\$35,000)

In recognition of the Maui Culinary Academy's successful partnerships with the local agricultural community, and for its achievements in training students to work in-and to establish—Maui's finest food and beverage establishments, the A&B Foundation established the first endowed culinary arts scholarship at the Academy. The A&B Culinary Arts Scholarship will be awarded to a culinary arts student who graduated from a Maui high school.



#### Hawaii Forest Institute

(\$1,500) - The A&B Foundation is a sponsor of the inaugural issue of the Hawaii Forest Institute's (HFI) Hawaii Forest Journal: A Publication for Environmental Stewardship. The publication showcases successful forestry and restoration projects, scientific research, use of native plants and woods, and issues related to forest stewardship. PHOTO: STEPHEN SMITH



### Hawaii Home-Ownership Center

(\$5,000) - The Hawaii HomeOwnership Center (HHOC) conducts homebuyer education classes statewide for potential first-time

homeowners in Hawaii. The orientation and course offer financial literacy training, one-on-one and post-purchase counseling, referrals to professional services, and links to affordable products. HHOC celebrated its 100th homeowner in 2005.



(\$10,000) - The students at Lanakila Elementary School receive fresh fruits and vegetables every week through the Ohana Produce Program. In 2004, the Hawaii Foodbank provided 31,000 bounds of



produce to students and their families.

### Community Clinic of Maui


(\$2,000) - A grant helped to fund hemoglobin screening tests for Community Clinic of Maui clients participating in the Women, Infants and Children



## VOLUNTEER MATCHING GIFTS



San Francisco Sailing Whaleboat Association (\$2,500) - A grant from

the A&B Foundation supported training activities of Sea Scouts in maritime operations, both at sea and ashore. Additional funds were provided to help salvage and repair one of its training ships.

The Foundation's Volunteer Matching Gift program was created to encourage and support employee volunteerism. A&B employees who give time from their busy schedules to community causes can earn a \$250 donation to that cause for just 25 hours of donated time.

All organizations with a 501 (c) (3) tax exempt status are eligible for the Volunteer Matching Gifts program. Recipients to date include youth sports organizations, boy and girl scouts, environmental causes, churches, schools, performing arts groups, retirement homes, and health and human service organizations.

Here are two examples of how the Volunteer Matching Gifts program has benefited both the employee and their organization.



Mel Kawano, finance manager at Kahului Trucking & Storage on Maui, has been involved with the Maui Junior Golf Association for four years and currently serves as treasurer for the organization. His daughter, Kelcie Ann, a junior golfer and sophomore at Maui High School is the primary reason for Mel's involvement. In addition to his treasurer's responsibilities, Mel also helps at golf tournaments, with youth clinics, and fundraises for the association. He has seen tremendous growth in the junior members and the organization, and he is proud to be a part of the Maui Junior Golf Association's success.
